MEDAL FOR GALLANTRY (MG)

Pilot Officer Warran Frank COWAN

For acts of gallantry in action in hazardous circumstances on 22 July 1942 as the plane captain of Lockheed Hudson A16-201.

Sergeant Russell Bradburn POLACK

For acts of gallantry in action in hazardous circumstances on 22 July 1942 as the plane navigator of Lockheed Hudson A16-201.

Sergeant Laurie Edwin SHEARD

For acts of gallantry in action in hazardous circumstances on 22 July 1942 as the aircraft gunner of Lockheed Hudson A16-201.

Pilot Officer David Reid TAYLOR

For acts of gallantry in action in hazardous circumstances on 22 July 1942 as the plane wireless operator of Lockheed Hudson A16-201.

MEDAL FOR GALLANTRY (MG)

Pilot Officer Warran Frank COWAN

For acts of gallantry in action in hazardous circumstances on 22 July 1942 as the plane captain of Lockheed Hudson A16-201.

During a daylight reconnaissance and ship shadowing action against the enemy occupied Buna beachhead, Pilot Officer Cowan demonstrated superior piloting and leadership skills while making valiant attempts to defeat multiple attacking Zero aircraft. Pilot Officer Cowan manoeuvred his bomber into violent high-speed turns, surprising the enemy by making repeated attacks. Eventually overwhelmed, the aircraft was crippled and crashed. Although killed in action in this engagement, the tenacity and skill of Pilot Officer Cowan and his crew left a lasting war and post-war impression on the enemy and is in keeping with the finest traditions of the Royal Australian Air Force and the Australian Defence Force.

Sergeant Russell Bradburn POLACK

For acts of gallantry in action in hazardous circumstances on 22 July 1942 as the plane navigator of Lockheed Hudson A16-201.

Displaying superior skills Sergeant Polack worked to facilitate a counter offensive engagement of multiple Japanese Zero aircraft. Outnumbered by enemy aircraft, the crew distinguished themselves through their cohesive efforts to ensure the aircraft presented the most defiant attacking profile possible to defend against the repeated enemy attacks. A fine example of tenacity and skill, this engagement left a lasting war and post-war impression on the enemy and is in keeping with the finest traditions of the Royal Australian Air Force and the Australian Defence Force.
